On account of my continued sickness and the uncertainty of life and not having property sufficient to specially benefit all my brothers and sisters and being of sound ~~mind~~ ^{and} disposing mind I desire in the event of my passing away that my property be disposed of as follows:

I bequeath to my sister Mary Green Two hundred dollars; to my sister Kate Blair Two hundred dollars to my sister Satchie Robinson Two hundred dollars to my sister Emma a Miller Two hundred dollars to my brother J. Campbell Ferguson one hundred dollars; and One hundred dollars for the purpose of erecting a grave stone or monument for father and mother, my interest in the home farm I bequeath to my brother Joshua Ferguson, my mortgage and all amounts owing by Calfat Ferguson are hereby released from payment. I bequeath to little Benjamin Ferguson son of Calfat Ferguson my gold watch and gold shoe buttons, of my eight shares of the new Enterprise orange grove street I desire two shares to Lou Dagley, of my four lots in Johnson City Tenn, I bequeath one lot to Binda Dagley One lot to Ruby Dagley one lot to Lou Dagley the residue of my estate including both real and personal property I bequeath to my sister Jessie Dagley and make her executor of this my last will and testament without requiring bond or security.
