

The last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Hall, I Elizabeth Hall
 knowing the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life and being
 prostrate on the bed of affliction and being conscious of the fact
 that I cannot resist only I make this will in line of my property
 made now in the hands of J. L. Davidson I am of sound mind
 mine though I have but little physical strength I want my
 estate with land money & property to be divided as follows
 First I have devised my real estate by Decree of which I wish to remain
 as heretofore made (as deeded) Second as to my personal estate
 I want my son Hays Hall if living and if dead at my death
 to receive \$1000 and if he is dead I want \$500 in money I will
 & bequeath to him also a copy of the Bible I will bequeath
 to Joe Hall (17th) One Hundred and twenty dollars in money, I will
 and bequeath to Julie and Frank Cornish \$500 I will give to John
 & Will Ferdinand Hall \$1000 One Hundred and fifty dollars I will
 give to Hall (\$250) Two Hundred dollars I want Maria Cornish to
 have (\$200) Two Hundred dollars. 3rd after the payment of the money
 as heretofore named in this Will, I want all cash notes and
 or checks (\$500) Six hundred dollars to be distributed by Trustee and
 son John Hall, that I now authorize that as my agent after my
 death to see and be sure to receive all cash notes and shares
 so long as the (1st) Six hundred dollars shall be out. If my business
 should be settled at an earlier date than the expiration of the 3rd
 of November & there is any left after the settlement of notes
 and other expenses incident thereto I want it equally divided
 with all my children except Alexander & Rebecca. I will
 my son John & Rebecca, I do not will or bequeath to either
 of them nor do I want either of them to have any part of my estate
 either real or personal, directly or indirectly. I want the right
 to make any change I may think so long as I live. This will
 written and made in the presence of witnesses this the 27th day of
 April 1873 and acknowledged by me in the presence of the states
 is my true Will and Testament
