LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

THE TESTATOR, A. M. LAYNE, of Betsy Layne, Floyd County, Kentucky, being of a sound mind desire to make my Last Will and Testament, and to bequeath my property as hereinafter set out:

1. I bequeath to my daughter, Zelia Mae Layne Pruitt, the property described as follows: Beginning on North side of Highway #28 at Victory Howes Line and running North with Howes Line to Sparrel Stratton's line; then west with Stratton's line to James B. Howes line; then south with Howes Line to State Highway No. 28, then east with the highway to the beginning.

I also bequeath to my daughter, Zelia Mae Layne Pruitt, a certain tract of land as follows: Beginning at the corner of Sparrel Stratton's Line on North side of Highway No. 28, and then running with Stratton's line to the top of Knob; then East with the same to James B. Howes, line; then south with said James B. Howes line to U S Highway No. 28; then West with the Highway to the beginning. (This is the same property I purchased from Kate Leslie, containing one acre, more or less.)

2. I bequeath to my grand daughter, Linda Kay Layne, the following described property: Beginning at U S Highway 28, on East side of my approach to my garage, and running South straight with my garage to the Big Sandy River; then East to Victoria Layne Howes Line; thence north with Howes line to Said Highway; then west with the Highway No. 28 to the beginning. (This is the place where she and her mother now live.)

3. I bequeath to my daughter, Betty Jean Layne Vaughn, the homeplace where I now live: Beginning at the U S Highway 28, on East side of approach to my garage, and running South straight with said garage to the Big Sandy River; thence West with the River to the Charles W. Gilley Line; thence North with the Gilley line to the U S Highway; thence running West with the Highway to the beginning. (This is the Old Home Place.)

4. I bequeath to my beloved wife, Georgia Mae Layne, the controlling interest, and use and occupancy of the home property where we now live, during her entire lifetime on the earth, and also the house on the hill above the Highway, where L. B. Spencer now lives. She shall also have all my personal property together with all the income I have coming in from all rentals and royalties from gas and oil, and all the cash which I may inherit from the estate of my father and mother. It is hereby expressly understood and agreed that at any time my wife should cease to be my widow then all the income from royalties shall be equally divided between my living children. After my Burial Expenses are Paid.

It is hereby understood that none of the property bequeathed to my children shall at any time be permitted to be sold to anyone who is not a legal heir of my family.

It is further agreed and understood that all the family shall have the right of using water from the water well on the hill, and that the upkeep of the same shall be shared by all who use water from the same.

At any time my wife ceases to be my widow, then all the property bequeathed to her shall become the property of my daughter Betty Jean Layne Vaughn.

THIS IS MY LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT and does hereby revoke all other wills heretofore made by me.
