Know all men by these presents, that we, David Murphy Allen and Rebecca Gearhart Allen, his wife, knowing as we do that life is uncertain and death is sure.

We therefore for the love and affection we have for the following named children viz: Norman Allen and May Allen, the only children born to us who have lived with us and worked with us and for us and Warrie Conley, a boy that we have raised since he was ten years old who have worked with us and for us.

We herein devise bequeath and set apart and Will all the real estate as hereafter bound and described.

(1) To Norman, as follows: Beginning at a rock set in the ground below the house on the lower side of the public road and the north corner of the medow fence at the upper end of the medow rock marked X thence across the bottom with the upper end of the medow fence a south direction thence leaving the fence running the same direction across the bottom to a rock set in the ground marked X thence down the center of the ditch a southeast course to main Salt Lick thence crossing said creek with a straight line to the mouth of a small drain where an ash tree now stands on the east bank of said branch thence up the center of said branch to where a wire fence now crosses to a small poplar tree marked on the west bank of said branch thence leaving said poplar tree with a southwest course with the center of a little point to the top of the point at Tom Turner line. Thence up the ridge with the center to Green Allen's line at the top of a knot at cool water and the head of the Green Gearhart branch; thence down the ridge an east course with Green Allen's line along the center of the ridge to a chimney rock at Joe Turner's line; thence down the side of the hill with Joe's line with a North course and crossing Salt Lick with Joe's line and continuing a north course up the hill with Joe's line to the top of the ridge in the west end of Salyer's Branch at the line of the Salyer Branch; thence up said ridge with the center of the ridge with Wm. Salyer's line thence up center to Wm. Salyer's line thence up the center of Wm. Salyer's line to the top of the knob on the east side of Isaac Creek and Wm. Salyer's branch; thence down the ridge with the center a south direction to opposite the head of a small drain running an east course toward the main Kink Branch at or near the foot of the hill at the head of said branch at a rock marked X where 3 drains connect; thence down the center of the main Kink Branch where D. H. Allen now lives to opposite where a mulberry tree now stands on the East bank of said branch; thence up the hill an east course by a marked white oak at the fence; then on up the hill with the fence to the corner of same where there is a rock marked X then around the hill with the fence an East course to the corner of same at a rock
