

Will of Elizabeth A. Layne

Last will of Elizabeth A. Layne by my own hand May 16, 1930
Knowing the shortness of life, and being in feeble health,
I desire to leave my estate in the following way:

1st I desire my debts to be paid, if my husband
and children deem it best, they may sell some piece
of property owned jointly by me and my husband
William H. Layne, to pay any indebtedness.

2nd I leave the income from the property owned by me
and my husband, W. H. Layne, his life time, and I leave
him management of our property, under bond.

3rd I will the home where we now live on
second avenue, to my husband, for his own.

4th I desire my property of whatever kind to be divided
equally between my three children Grace Burke,
Frank Layne, and Angeline Layne, except for the one
half I have paid for Frank Layne's education.
He must account to Grace Burke and Angeline Layne
for that, before he can share equally beginning
from Sept 1926.

5th I leave my Cash, Bank, Stock, to my husband
W. H. Layne.

6th I desire that my husband take care of my
daughter, Angeline Layne providing for her
till such a time as she becomes married.

7th The intention of this will is to leave my husband
the income from our joint property his
lifetime and the management of our
affairs as long as his health permits him
to work and to leave the property itself
to my three children, Grace Burke,
Frank Layne, and Angeline Layne at his death.
