 & James W. Smith partners of & through trustees to have charge of all my
 property real and personal and hold and manage it and appropriate
 it to the hereinafter designated purposes & objects with power to
 perpetuate their perpetual succession as long as there is any necessity
 for it by being hereby empowered to sell & convey in their own and
 by resignation or deed said house may employ a secretary at a
 reasonable salary and employ counsel when necessary to settle
 up all the business intrusted to them and to this end are empowered
 to sell & take and borrow and sell and make titles to any real estate
 I may be seized of at my decease and apply the funds & income first
 in paying any obligations I may be under at my decease
 and all necessary expense incurred in settling up my business
 and all my assets have been properly ascertained and all my
 obligations together with all necessary expense have been paid
 and trustee shall apply the balance as follows First Twenty thousand
 \$20,000- in cash or bonds or stock as may be desired
 by her to be given to my beloved wife Sarah together with
 the use of a comfortable house and Twelve hundred dollars per
 year during her life or the time she remains my widow and
 Five thousand dollars to be given William C. McBride if he is
 then alive and five hundred dollars each to my daughters
 Mary & Josephine and sister daughter and one thousand dollars to my sister
 Doreen if she is then alive and all the balance to be appor-
 tioned as follows the principal to be invested in some good and
 secure bonds the interest to be divided equally for thirty years and
 then to assist some indigent young man to get an education
 to fit him for the office of minister of the Gospel in this country
 one third to assist weak and struggling congregations to
 build houses to worship in to be given them as a loan from
 three to ten years without interest said loans to be made through
 the Board of Church Extension of the W. P. Church of North America
 and the remaining third to be paid into the Board of foreign missions
 to be applied to the education of young men in foreign fields
 preparing for the ministry of Gods Word and Superior of such
 there are needing assistance among the Nations attached to the
 foreign missions of the United Presbyterian Church of North
 America After the thirty years before mentioned have expired
 the General of the United Presbyterian Church of North
 America may continue the distribution of the fund as he deems
 for twenty years longer if in their judgment they shall in that
 way be most beneficial to the cause of Religion or they may
 alter the proportion to dispose mentioned or they may apply it
