

I George W. Conley of Bonanza in the County of Floyd and State of Kentucky of the age of 48 years and being of sound mind, is freely and lawfully, do make, publish and declare this my last will and Testament in the following manner that is to say:

First I give and bequeath to my daughter Virgie Musie and Henry Musie her husband all my household furniture, goods and chattels, and all effects which may be at my death in and about my dwelling house excepting one bed and furnishings thereof belonging to my Son Willie C. Conley. Second I give and devise to my daughter Virgie Musie and Henry Musie her husband all that certain tract or parcel of land lying on the waters of Abbott Creek in Floyd County Kentucky and being the same land conveyed to the Testator herein by W. M. Stone and wife by deed bearing date of January 29th 1912. and recorded in Deed Book No. 34 Page 280 etc Floyd County Court Clerks office containing Ten acres more or less and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a rock corner to B. A. Conleys land; thence with the said Conley line up the hill to a rock on the top of the point to a J. Stanley line, thence down the hill with the said Stanley line to a pickery bush near the mouth of a small drain thence across the hauch to a small horn beam thence across the bottom to a small white oak near a small drain on A. S. Stanley line and with said line to a black oak on top of the point to a J. Conley line thence with the said Conley line to the creek to a Beech stump thence down the creek with the meanderings of the same to the beginning so as to include all the land in said tract except the mineral having been sold and conveyed by former deed. To have and to hold to them their heirs and assigns forever provided always and this will is upon the following conditions that is to say: If the said Virgie Musie and Henry Musie her husband, shall be dead to and furnish the within described tract together with all the food and raiment to the said George W. Conley and Prudence Conley his wife during their natural life together with medical attendance

and respectable burial also a home for our Son Willie C. Conley what time he remains single and so desires to pursue our natural lives that the will shall be in full force; otherwise to be null and void.
