An instrument of writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Hiram Calhoun deceased and the execution of same having been duly proven in open Court by the oath of ~~attesting~~ ^{testator} witnesses to said instrument and the same having laid over the required time by law for exceptions, and none having been taken or had.

It is now ordered by the Court that said will be established as the last will and testament of Hiram Calhoun, deceased, and be admitted to record as such.

Will of Rev. Hiram Calhoun,

I, Hiram Calhoun of Prestonsburg, County of Floyd, and State of Kentucky, being of full age and of sound mind and memory, do hereby make declare and publish this to be my last will and testament, revoking all wills and testaments heretofore made by me. First, I devise unto my son Charlie Calhoun the following described real estate, situated in Floyd County, Ky, and lying on the waters of Bull Creek and bounded as follows:

beginning at the F. O. Hopkins line at the branch and running with the branch to the line of G. J. Wright, thence up the ridge with said G. J. Wright's line in a north westerly course to the top of the hill, thence down the ridge with Joe Wallace's line to the beginning.

Provided however that the said Charlie Calhoun, named herein, is to pay to Mrs. Leticia Goodman, wife of Garland Goodman, the sum of (\$25.00) twenty five dollars and to Mary Belle Hallen, wife of Joe Hallen, (\$25.00) twenty five dollars and to Helen Garrett, the wife of Seymour Garrett, the sum of (\$25.00) twenty five dollars, and to John C. Calhoun, children Ezra Calhoun, and Nora Buschett wife of Theodor Buschett, the sum of (\$25.00) twenty five dollars to be equally divided between them.

Second. I devise unto my son Tommy Calhoun all the rest and residue of my real estate. Provided however, that my son Tommy Calhoun is to move into the house where I now live and take care of myself and wife, Mary Belle Calhoun, as long as either of us should live. The said Tommy Calhoun is to move into the home with me for the above named purpose I think it is necessary. It is also provided that in the event the said Tommy Calhoun should die before either myself or wife Mary Belle Calhoun, that the real estate herein devised to said Tommy Calhoun is to be used as a home for either myself or wife as long as either should live.

Third.

I bequeath to my son Tommy Calhoun, all my personal property. Provided that the said Tommy Calhoun is to pay all debts against me at my death, and also the funeral expenses of my self and wife. Fourth: It is my desire that my son Tommy Calhoun, be appointed administrator of my estate, and that no Bond be required. Fifth I hereby bequeath unto my wife Mary Belle Calhoun, any and all money which I may have in any bank at my death.

Sixth: It is also provided that the said Tommy Calhoun is to pay to William Calhoun, heir, the sum of (\$25.00) twenty five dollars and to Marie Calhoun, the sum of (\$25.00) twenty five dollars and to my son Taylor Calhoun, the sum of (\$25.00) twenty five dollars.
