Will of Zachariah Stephens

Cliff Floyd County, Ky.

Known all men by these presents that I Zachariah Stephens do this day make and declare this to be my last will and testament

① First all my just debts and funeral expenses be fully paid

② Second I bequeath unto my son Thomas Stephens a certain tract or parcel of land situated in Floyd County and State of Kentucky and on Stephens Branch and bounded and described as follows to wit,

beginning at the little bench at the branch below the house thence up the hill to the top of the point thence up the ridge to the top of the hill.

thence round to Hopson line, thence down the point to the hog field thence down the wire fence to the fourth post from the gully thence round the bench to a brace Walnut thence around the bench by the Coal bank to another black walnut near the gully thence a straight line to Stephens garden and County road thence with the County road to the beginning.

③ Third I bequeath unto my son Thomas Stephens a certain tract or parcel of land situated in Floyd County and State of Kentucky and on Stephens Branch and bounded and described as follows to wit, beginning at the top of the point and following Stephens line, thence down the point with the joining fence to a brace on the bank of the branch thence crossing the branch to a gully thence up the gully
