I, Netta Newsom of McDowell, Floyd County, Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make, declare, and publish this my last will and testament, revoking all former wills by me made,

Item #1. It is my will and desire that all of my land situated across the road from here I now live and herein after described in item #2, be disposed of in the following manner hereinafter set out:

Item #2. Bounded on the North by the land of S. T. Head, on the East by the County Road, on the South by the land of Dory Newsom, on the West by Dory Newsom's yard, containing about one fifth of an acre more or less.

Item #3. On the account of my receiving money from the estate of my deceased son Owen Hall, I give and devise the above described land to my son Andy Hall and my daughter Dory Newsom, they being a full brother and sister to Owen, the lower one-half to Andy, and the upper one-half to Dory.

WILL OF JAMES SHORT

I, James Short, of Bonanza, Floyd County, Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, publish and declare this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me previously made.

ARTICLE I: I give and devise to my beloved wife, Mollie Short, the "State Place or Farm" located on the Conley Fork of Abbott Creek, which land adjoins the lands purchased from Walter Vaughan, including house and barn, and about two (2) acres of land, to be hers absolutely and in fee simple.

ARTICLE II: All notes now due me, or which will hereafter become due, I give and bequeath to my wife, Mollie Short, and she is to pay all debts owing by me at the time of my decease, from the proceeds of said notes, and the land referred to in Article one (1) herein, the remainder to be hers individually.

ARTICLE III: I give and devise to my son, Arminos Short, the surface of my farm located on the Conley Fork of Abbott Creek, known as the Walter Vaughan Farm, and being the farm on which he now lives. All coal, oil and gas or other mineral or metallic substances from and under this land, I reserve and dispose of in Article V of this will.

ARTICLE IV: All the residue of my real estate, which includes the entire farm on which I now live, excepting a small tract including the mansion house and outbuildings, which has been by me previously conveyed to my daughter, Gladys Short, I give and devise to my son, Forrest D. Short. My daughter, Gladys Short, and my daughter Dorothy S. Burke, to be divided equally and in equal proportions among them. All minerals, including coal, oil and gas, and other minerals and mineral substances from and under the lands referred to in this Article, I reserve and dispose of in Article V of this will.

ARTICLE V: All minerals, or mineral substances, including coal, oil and gas from and under the lands referred to in Article III and Article IV hereof, I give, devise and bequeath to my four (4) children: Arminos Short, Forrest D. Short, Gladys Short and Dorothy S. Burke, to be divided equally and in equal proportions between them, subject to Article VII of this will.

ARTICLE VI: I desire that my wife, Mollie Short, shall have full charge supervision and control of all the lands of which I die seized, which includes all the lands referred to in Article III, and Article IV hereof, for and during her natural life, after her death to pass as provided in Article III and Article IV.

ARTICLE VII: I desire that my wife, Mollie Short, shall receive, collect and use for her own benefit all royalties, rentals or incomes from oil and gas on all my lands for and during her natural life, and after her death said royalties rentals and incomes to pass as set out in Article V hereof.

ARTICLE VIII: I make, nominate and appoint, Forrest D. Short of Prestonsburg, Floyd County, Kentucky, to be executor of this my last will and testament, said executor to qualify without bond.
