

Will of J. W. Alley

I, J. W. Alley, being of full age and of sound mind and memory, and realizing that life is short and death is certain, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

Item, I direct that all of my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

Item, after my just debts and funeral expenses shall have been paid, I will, demise I will, demise and bequeath to my beloved wife

Viola Alley all of my real and personal property of all nature and descriptions to use in any way she may desire and to sell and dispose of the same at her disposal.

Item I It is my request and my beloved wife Viola Alley, shall have the right to see and dispose of my property situate lying and being in Prestonsburg, Kentucky, for the purpose of reinvesting the proceeds thereof in other property, if she so desires after my death.

Item 4 I hereby make, constitute and appoint my son Charles W. Alley as my executor of this my last will and testament, to act for and on behalf of my beloved wife Viola Alley, to see that this my last will and testament is carried into effect and he will not be required to execute bond in any sum whatever for his performance as executor of this my last will and testament.
