publish and declare this to be my last will and
testament in manner and form following
hereby revoking any will or wills heretofore made
by me First I direct all my just debts to be
Paid including a note given by me to my
daughter Ella W. Redpath with six per cent
interest to the time of payment to be paid
said also my burial expenses as soon as
conveniently may be after my decease second
I desire and direct that my real Estate and
Personal Property shall be disposed of as
follows to wit

To my two daughters Ida R. McKim and
Ella W. Redpath I give, devise and bequeath
My Lot No 38 situate between Fourth & Fifth
streets on the south side of Market Street in the
Borough of Frederick County and State aforesaid
having erected thereon a three story brick ~~stone~~
building and a two story frame dwelling
house. Also that lot of ground situate on the north
side of Washington Street East by Stewart
Street in the Borough of Frederick County and
State aforesaid having a frontage on Washing-
ton Street of one hundred and twenty (20) feet
more or less and extending back along
Elm Alley a distance of one hundred and
forty two (42) feet more or less having
erected thereon a two story frame
house. Also that certain lot piece

of ground situate at the corner of
Fourth Street and Cherry Alley in the Borough
of Frederick County and State aforesaid having a
frontage on Fourth Street of Eighty (80) feet
more or less and extending back along said
Alley to line of a adjoining property a distance
of two hundred and (200) feet more or less
thence to Alley on the Northwest thence west to
line of Charles Simpson thence south to corner
of Charles Simpson and Jackson Streets the corner
then named thence in said Simpson's line to
Fourth Street. To my grandson Merle C. McKim
I give devise and bequeath all that certain
lot or piece of ground situate on the North
East Corner of Washington Street and Stewart Street
in the Borough of Frederick County and State aforesaid
having a frontage on Washington Street
of Thirty Seven (37) feet and extending back along
the line of Stewart Street a distance of sixty (60)
feet. All my Estate Real and Personal and
mixed of any kind and description situate
and being in the State of Kentucky. Also I give
devise and bequeath in fee simple absolute
to my two daughters to keep, to sell and make
deeds for as they may deem for their best interests
After my decease. It is all other real and personal
Estate in Frederick County and adjacent to my said
daughters share and share alike. I know it was
removed many years ago that a woman who
is and always was unknown to me claimed
to have and had a Certificate of marriage
to my deceased son J. W. Redpath and when
I now know had any knowledge of the same
therefore in case there may have been any issue
of said claimed marriage I desire my
executors to give one dollar to each of
any such persons who shall prove to the

selection of my executors to be the
 certain name of said unown marriage.

I hereby appoint as my executor of
 this my last will and testament my ^{deceased}
 Ida B McEea and Edward Redpath and
 my son in law J. Percy McEea.
