Will of Miles Pratt

In the Name of God Amen:
that I, Miles Pratt of Lingby Floyd County,
Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing
Memory, do hereby make and publish
and declare this, my last will and
testament hereby revoking any and
all wills of whatever kind or character
heretofore made by me.

Item 1: I direct that all my just debts
and funeral expenses to be paid out
of my estate as soon as practicable,
after the time of my decease.

Item 2: I give, devise and bequeath to
Narcie Hays wife of Lingby Hays (she being
the only living daughter of my first wife
Alafar) my ~~estate~~ farm in fee simple
known as the Home farm located at
the mouth of Ball Branch of Jones Fork
Creek, Knott County Kentucky, it being
my intention to bequeath to her, all the
