and testament.

First out of my personal estate, I desire that all my just debts
be paid.

I give to my grandson Isaac & Catharine one of my United States
Government Bonds the sum of \$500 in face value. I give
to my daughter Mary Margaret Richmond one of my U. S. Govern-
ment Bonds the sum of \$500 in face value of Bonds.

I give to my son & daughter Lucy May Richmond one of my
U. S. Government Bonds the sum of \$500 in face value of
Bonds.

I give to my son & daughter Mary Catharine \$500 of my
Fidelity-Elkhorn Preferred stock - He have practically raised Mary
and she is not right alone is reason for the difference in bequests
among these bond children.

I will to my beloved wife, Mary B. Richmond the front of the
brick store building and the property on the east corner leased
to the Colonial Ice & Cold Co. together my other stocks and Bonds
except stock in the Isaac Richmond and Co. I also request
that whatever remains at my death that remainder be equally
divided among my three children.

I give to our three children the sum of \$500 each and to Isaac
Catharine & David B. Richmond my stock in the same Isaac and
Co. and all my other stock. And I also request that the property be
mainly given to my wife - Request that no money be absolutely
necessary that the mineral be not divided. All household and
other furniture to be kept by my wife - David to take all the
