First.- I direct my Executor hereinafter named, to pay from proceeds from my estate, as soon as possible all my just debts, together with the expenses of my last sickness and my funeral and testamentary expenses.

Second.- I give and devise to my daughter Kathryn May Gibson the apartment building and the land on which the same is located and which property is known as 408- Fifth Avenue, in the City of Huntington, Cabell County, West Virginia, together with all the household goods, furniture, equipment and appliances and every other thing of value that I may own which is located on, in or about these said premises.

Third.- I give and devise to my beloved husband, Doctor A.P. Gibson and to my daughter Kathryn Mae Gibson, my dwelling house where I now reside and the land on which the same is situated, which property is known as number 232- Fifth Avenue in the City of Huntington, County of Cabell in West Virginia, together with all household goods, furniture, personal belongings, equipment and all other things of value in, on or about the said premises, TO BE HELD AND ENJOYED BY MY SAID HUSBAND AND MY SAID DAUGHTER DURING THE LIFETIME OF MY SAID HUSBAND, and at the decease of my said husband, I give and devise the said property in it's entirety to the said daughter Kathryn Mae Gibson, her heirs and assigns forever.

Fourth.- I give and devise to my two married daughters, Virginia Duri and Genevieve Underwood, Share and Share alike, the whole of all REAL, PERSONAL and/or mixed property that I own and which is located in the Commonwealth of Kentucky- Said Kentucky property consists of the following: An undivided One Third 1/3 interest in a certain brick dwelling and the land on which it is located, being in Central Avenue, in the City of Ashland, Boyd County, Kentucky- also, TWO HUNDRED ACRES, more or less, of certain MINERAL LAND located on NATH CREEK, Floyd County, Kentucky, together with any sum or sums of money that may be due me as a royalty from leases on said Floyd County property, and all land, improvements and appurtenances hereon that I own and which is situated in Pike County, State of Kentucky, and all its to, together with any sum or sums that may be due me as royalties from leases thereon.

Fifth.- I hereby appoint my husband, Doctor A. P. Gibson the SOLE EXECUTOR of this MY LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT, hereby revoking all former wills, by me, at anytime made.
