

WILL OF G. W. AKERS

I, G. W. Akers of Ambs, in the county of Floyd and the State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament:

First: I order and direct that my executor hereinafter named, pay all my just debts and funeral expenses as soon after my decease as conveniently may be.

Second: after the payment of such funeral expenses and debts, I give devise and bequeath unto my four children, namely, Earnest Akers, Vannie Akers Allen, Ted Akers and Astor Akers, in equal parts, all of the residue of my estate both real and personal.

Third: In the event of the death of Astor Akers without legal child or children, then it is my wish and I hereby direct and request that their portion of the estate both real and personal, revert equally to the survivor or survivors of the children herein before mentioned.

Fourth: I do hereby make, constitute and appoint the cashier of the First National Bank, of Prestonsburg, Kentucky, whosoever he may be, to serve as executor of this my last will and testament: hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
