Walker I will and bequeath to Thomas Wright the absolute property in and to all my property of whatsoever kind upon this condition that if the said Thomas Wright gives evidence of drunkenness or other bad habits or manifests a disposition to waste or squander any or all of the property herein bequeathed to him then he is to take nothing under this Will and in that event I will that my property be sold and the proceeds of the same to be applied in furnishing the Southern Baptist Church South Main in cause of construction in the Town of Jackson Ky and for the purpose of having the property above named sold and expended in the manner above directed. I hereby appoint W. H. Hays and John W. Hays Trustees for the church above named and I give and bequeath to my brother James S. Walker and to my sister Louisa Lockhart the sum of Ten Dollars each to be paid out of the proceeds of my personal estate. I hereby appoint and create A. B. Brown and Walter S. Harkins my Executors to execute this my last Will and Testament and to settle my estate. Witness my hand and signatures subscribed in the presence of J. H. Davidson and Walter S. Harkins as attesting witnesses the 11th day of September 1857.
