Will of William Callins

I William Callins do hereby declare publicly, Kentucky being of full age and of sound mind and memory, do make, publish, and declare this to be my last will and Testament hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

Item 2. All the property, real and personal of every kind and description, wherever situated, which I may own or have the right to dispose of at the time of my decease, I give, bequeath and leave to my children as follows: S. M. Callins, S. Callins, J. O. Callins, Mary Bebler, the heirs of Tildon Callins deceased, Jonathan Callins, S. Callins and Sarah Callins each a one fourth part of my whole estate.

Item 3. My debts due me from any of my said children at the time of my death which has not been paid in full at the time of the settlement of my estate shall be paid to the executor of my estate at such time and of money paid to the executor of my estate shall be deducted from the whole amount as portion due to said child at the time of said settlement.

Item 4. I make nominate and appoint S. M. Callins of Huntington West Virginia, to be the executor of this my last will and Testament said executor is to act without feeling a bond.
