

I, Frances Osborn, being of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament.

1: I direct that all my just debts including all my burial expenses, taxes, and other expenses, be paid by my Administrator.

2: I direct that all my notes accounts and all other debts in the way of debts be collected as well as can be done by my Administrator except as hereinafter provided.

3: I direct that all my other personal property except my household goods, clock furniture and utensils be sold by my Administrator as so to realize as much as he can from the sale of same.

4: I bequeath to my children James L Stungell \$150; J. P. Stungell \$200; A. J. Stungell \$230. To my sisters, Patience Jane Keathley \$300; Cornelia Osborn \$200; Malinda C. Johnson \$200. To my nephew Joseph Stungell \$75. To all the other of James L Stungell's children \$85 to be divided equally among them. To my nephews Columbus Johnson \$25 and to John Jacob Johnson \$25. To my niece Mabel Howell \$50. And Columbus Roberts the one-half of the amount of a certain note she owes to me and Samuel Osborn - whole note \$135. I bequeath to A. J. Stungell a \$250 note secured by mortgage. I bequeath to J. P. Stungell the balance due on a certain note given for \$100 which is secured by mortgage also the remainder of the amount of all other notes I held against him after deducting all I owe him for merchandise.

5: I bequeath to my brother A. J. Stungell and my nephew William T. Osborn all my one-third interest in a certain lot of standing timber on the Simpson's Reedy farm provided I have not disposed of same before the intestate of this will and if sold by me the proceeds are to be given to them.

6: I direct that my household goods, clock furniture and utensils be divided as near equally as may conveniently be done among my brother and sisters viz: J. L. Stungell, A. J. Stungell, Patience J. Keathley, Cornelia Osborn and Malinda C. Johnson.

7: I further direct that in case that the proceeds from the collections and sales hereinafore provided for are less than the amount of the bequests, that each and every amount hereinafore bequeathed shall be received in the ratio of said amounts and in case of the net proceeds exceeding the total of said bequests I hereby bequeath to my nieces Mary M. Elliott and Rhoda J. Roberts the excess of said bequests to be divided equally between them.

8: I hereby appoint W. T. Osborn Administrator of this my last will.

9: In case of death of any legatee herein, I direct that the amount bequeathed him or her be given to

his or her heirs.
