 I Alexander Macey of Amherst County and State of New York, being infirm
 in body but of sound mind, do make and publish this my last will and testament
 hereby revoking all others by me heretofore made, First, I bequeath to my wife Phebe
 Macey to hold use and enjoy during her natural life the tract of land whereon
 I now live, with all its appurtenances together with two hundred and fifty acres adjoining
 to the said land in the most convenient manner in the county I bought of
 Constantine Perkins, and also to do the last injury to the residue of land that I
 own in said County, survey, I also lend to my wife as appurtenances my house, hold,
 tield and kitchen furniture, my stock of all kinds, and all my farming utensils,
 and the following negroes, Saml, Sabid and his wife with all their children, & a
 negro girl named Lucy, to hold and use during her life as aforesaid, the crops
 growing when this will takes effect, except the tobacco, I also give to my wife together
 with all provisions needful for family use, I give to my daughter Sally
 Macey during to her full and entire life one thousand dollars, and her mother's
 death to be paid her in support from the late above named, to be collected & valued
 by my executor, I give to my grand son Alexander King & give a negro boy now
 in Woodford County, being the youngest of Lucy's two sons, to be named him at the
 death of my son John who holds said negro during her life, I also give him
 and bed and furniture, I also give and bequeath the whole of my estate both
 real and personal of any description including the property lend to my wife as aforesaid
 after her death, as well as all my other lands, ten lots and slaves, or who ever she
 John or may hereafter acquire to, Elias M. Noel, John Munn and Septimiah Dudgey
 Executors and Trustees of this my last will, to have and to hold the same as trust
 for the following uses and purposes, to wit, First, to pay all my just debts, &
 Secondly, to pay the following legacies, to wit, To my son Alexander Macey Three
 thousand dollars, To my son Jefferson Macey three thousand dollars, &
 To my daughter Sally Macey three thousand dollars in addition to the legacy
 already given her in this will, And whatever residue may be left after paying
 the debts and legacies aforesaid, my will and desire is after my estate is fully
 settled that the residue or remainder thereof, be equally divided between the
 following children, to wit, Alexander B. Macey, Leander Macey, Jefferson Macey
 Mary Linsinger and Sally Macey my trustees aforesaid, or any two of them are
 hereby and fully authorized and empowered, to sell and to convey the whole or
 any part of the estate devised to them as aforesaid in trust, in such terms and
 such manner as they may deem most expedient, in order to effect the
 trust hereby conferred to them, My desire is that the following negroes be
 first sold, Isaac, Dick, Sam and Adam, and that George be hired out
 from year to year while he lives for the benefit of my estate, &
 My son Charles has already received his portion of my estate and my desire is
 that he should pay his two debt I owe for about eight hundred dollars, and
 that my executor apply that money to the purchase of young negroes
 belonging to my estate for the benefit of my wife during her life and then

to be disposed of and distributed by said executor in a part of my
 of my estate to the same children, equal portions, My daughter Sally
 received her portion of my estate, To my son pastams I have bequeathed
 the tract of land whereon he resides, with its appurtenances (which tract
 was not measured with the property devised in trust as aforesaid) upon condition
 that he pay to my executors the sum of eight hundred dollars which he
 owes, and also the further sum of whatever may be due me of several hundred
 dollars which he was to pay for the rent of my estate in the year 1815, and
 for the year 1819. It is to be understood that three fourths of the arrearance
 this tract is received for the use of my family, and likewise one of the same
 and content as that was when he received it in possession which is to be paid
 and received on the tract whereon I now live, and to keep this best situated for
 My desire is that Pastams should not be coerced to pay the above sum
 speedily, but that he should be accountable for the interest thereon as well
 as principal. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this 20th day of May 1820 in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty two.

Codicil to the foregoing will. The tract of land devised to Constantine
 Macey is to include all the land he now has in possession, part of which
 I purchased of John Noel, and the balance which is about ten hundred
 acres, I bought from Constantine Perkins, making in the whole tract
 to him as aforesaid, about seven hundred acres, to be paid and sealed this
 day of May 1820.
