 their Share or Portion of the Lands above devise'd shall be Equally
 Divided Share and Share alike among the Survivors of my said Children.
 And Provided further That my Executors herein after named shall have
 full Power and absolute Authority to sell and convey two Thousand acres
 of my said Estate, if they shall judge it proper and expedient for
 the purpose of satisfying the Debts of my said Children and to pay
 and discharge the Debts hereafter for the further securing the said above
 Mention'd, And I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Adam
 my beloved wife Elizabeth, and my son Michael to be the Executors of this
 my last will and Testament, fully trusting and committing all other
 and former Wills by me heretofore made, and Declaring this to be my
