Fenwick's
Will

In the name of the ever blessed and
adorable Trinity God the Father God
the son & God the Holy Ghost Amen

I Balinda Fenwick being in a very
poor law, state of health & feeble in body but in my
sound senses good memory & understanding do make
Publish and declare this instrument to contain my
last will and Testament hereby also declaring all
former will or wills made by me null & void

First, my will and desire is after my decease that
my Executor herein hereafter named do see my body
decently buried in a Christian like manner agreeable to
the rules, rules and Ceremonies of the ever truly Roman
apostolic Catholic Church of which (the aforesaid)

First, my will and desire is that my said Executor
do pay all my Lawfull Just debts of every kind by
such ways & means as he may think proper and
the exigence of my Estate may require.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth
Calhoon, a negro boy named Joe one bed and furniture
together with all my Tea and other Crochery ware
of every kind and the miniature of my son Joseph
Fenwick to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Fenwick &
children Ten dollars to be equally divided between
them or such of them as may be living

Fifthly I give & bequeath to my son Enoch Fenwick

a negro girl named Eliza one bed & furniture
his choice of my Iron pot & kach to him his heirs
& assigns forever

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my son Henry
Fenwick one bed & furniture to him his heirs and
assigns forever Provided however that my said son
Henry do pay the Rev. Edward D Fenwick Ten
Dollars for Pious uses or purposes.

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my son Ignatius
M Fenwick a negro woman named Bet. Beget and one
bed & furniture to him his heirs and assigns forever

Eighthly all my Estate of every kind not hereon other
wise disposed of my will & desire is shall be equally
divided between my daughter Elizabeth Calhoon &
my two sons Enoch & Ignatius Fenwick or otherwise
as they may agree among themselves the same shall
be sold and the money arising therefrom be equal
ly divided between my said daughter Elizabeth &
two sons Enoch & Ignatius on this condition however
that my said daughter Elizabeth & two sons Enoch &
Ignatius do pay Twenty five dollars each towards
the late purchase of one hundred and Eighty five
acres of land from Simon Hechey intended for Church
purposes Provided never the less and the said pay
ments of Twenty five dollars each shall be made
should the Right Rev. Doct. Carroll the present
Bishop of Baltimore and his successors be consulted
and his or their instructions followed in making the
title to the aforesaid one hundred & Eighty five acres
land - Provided also that should the

Purchase of one hundred & eighty six Acres of land
 said and not be carried into effect for the purposes
 aforesaid by any means; that it is my Will & Desire
 (and it is the condition on which the aforesaid legacies
 last made to my said daughter & two sons) that my
 said (Daughters Elizabeth and my two sons Enoch &
 Ignatius shall pay the aforesaid Twenty five Dollars
 each for pious or Church purposes under the Directions
 & Instructions (to what purposes) of the Right Rev.
 Doct. Carroll Bishop of Baltimore. His successors
 Successors to such purpose as he or they may direct
 Mouth and lastly, I appoint my Son Ignatius
 Fenwick my sole executor to this my last will &
 Testament. In Witness whereof I the said Balinda
 Fenwick have hereunto set my hand & seal the Twenty
 eighth day of May One Thousand Eight hundred &
 Eight.

 This 2nd day of May in the year of our Lord
 1804, I Thomas Lewis of Franklin County
 & State of Kentucky, being in perfect health
 of body, & sound memory. Thanks be to God for the same, and
 calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die
 do make & Ordain this my last will & Testament in man
 and form following. That is to say first & Principally I recom
 mend my soul to God, who gave it to me, and my body to
 the Earth, from whence it was taken, to be buried in such
 like manner as my Executor hereafter mentioned shall think
 proper, and us to such worldly Estate it hath pleased God
 to bless me with, I dispose of as follows to wit.

Item, my will and desire is that all my just debts & personal
 Expenses be first paid & discharged.

Item I give & bequeath, all my Estate, both real, & personal
 to my beloved wife Ann Lewis & her heirs forever, whom I
 appoint my whole & sole Executor of this my last will &
 Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand & affixed my seal, the day & date above
 written.
