in manner following Viz. I give & bequeath to Catharine Harris Child, & Maria Knott Inis, all the Estate of every kind which I have in possession or may have a claim to which is to be equally divided between them, & to their heirs forever.

I do appoint Harry Inis my Executor with full power to adjust my account as ^{officer of Isaac Hicks} against ^{Govorth of the State of Ohio} in any manner he shall think most to the advantage of my Legatee. Intestimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 21. day of August 1803.

In the name of God Amen I Henry Crutcher of the County of Franklin and State of Kentucky being of perfect strength of mind and memory but calling to mind the Transitory and fleeting

State of Time and Things, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following

To wit. In presence I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha Crutcher, during her natural life or widowhood and after her death or marriage, to go my children, and be divided among them as herein after mentioned the land and house where I now live, supposed to contain ninety one and an half acres, all the farming tools and plantation utensils thereon, all my stocks of Horses, Two Cows and Calves, four head of Sheep, ten head of Hogs, all the Geese, the house hold and kitchen furniture of every description including my beds and bedding. Also Two Negroes, one named Charles about fourteen years old and the other named Celia about nine years old.

In presence I give and bequeath to my children Isaac Crutcher, Isaac Crutcher, Elizabeth Pemberton, and Catharine Cook to them and their heirs forever the following Negroes To wit, a negro woman named Lucy, two negro fellows one named Phillip and the other named David and a negro girl named Harriet and their increase. Also all the remainder of my Stock not herein before mentioned in my will, and desire is that the Negroes & their increase and the Stock last mentioned, at my death shall be equally divided among my said appointed children and further it is my will and desire that

death or marriage of my said wife Martha that the
two negroes Charles and Celia and their increase together
with all the remainder of the property herein given her
as aforesaid (The House and land excepted) shall be also
equally divided among my last mentioned Children
and their heirs and I do give and bequeath the same
accordingly.

Item premises. I give and bequeath to my Sons Henry &
Neben Crutcher to them and their heirs forever and to
be equally divided among them, the House and land
whereon I now live; but they are not to have possession
thereof during the life or widowhood of my said wife
Martha, without her consent or approbation. And
whereas by the death of W^m Am Beasley of Caroline
County Virginia, and the will of her deceased husband
William Beasley, I am entitled by marriage with my
said wife Martha to a certain proportion of the
Estate of said deceased. It is my will and desire
that whatever title or interest I may have in and
to the said Estate last mentioned shall be equally
divided among my said sons Henry & Neben Crutcher
and their heirs forever, and I do bequeath the same to them
accordingly. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint
my sons in law William Cook & James Sacray, and Jesse
Barton and Edmund Beasley executors of this my last
will and Testament. And I do hereby revoke and annul
and every other will or wills by me heretofore made.

And I do further hereby declare, publish and acknow-
ledge this and this only to be my last will and
Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto signed

of September 1806 (six)
