

I John W. McLanahan of Franklin County and State of Kentucky do hereby make this my last will and testament revoking all others being weak of body but of perfect sense and memory.

First I wish all my just debts to be paid, they are but few and none of magnitude.

Secondly I desire my moiety of my estate of good land whatsoever remaining after the payment of my debts, to my sister Polly Stale and her heirs forever.

Thirdly I devise the other moiety of my estate to my executors hereinafter mentioned, to be appropriated by them in their discretion to the uses of my sister Belcy, wife of John and her heirs forever.

Fourthly The division of my estate to be made by my executors according to their discretion.

Fifthly My wish is that my executors should not be compelled to give the bond and security as required by law, nor to be liable to any suits and expenses and a special meeting. Therefore I wish my father Thomas McLanahan and my brother in law Thomas Stale, executor of this my last and true testament.

I have given & bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth McFarren the property which she has already received be disposed of as follows when Lucy Clarke comes of age her sister Ellen or marry the Negroes Nancy & her children and Ann or her price for which she was sold to be divided into three parts One third to Lucy One third part to Elizabeth and the balance with furniture stock &c to my Daughter Elizabeth, then should Lucy or Ellen die without their part of the property is to revert back to Elizabeth Mother and her heirs also the amount of
