Pursuant to an order of the County Court of Franklin
 at their February Court 1800, we the undersigned have
 and at the house of J. W. & J. W. Hoxley & examined
 the different vouchers presented to us and do report
 as follows viz. that the Commissioners appointed pursuant
 to an order of the County Court of Franklin to divide
 at their January term 1805 to set apart and divide
 the estate of said Patrick Cairns, between the widow
 & heirs of the said Cairns, & Hoxley dec'd. that the negroes
 were valued at the sum of \$6400, there being five
 children made each child's part equal to \$1280
 there we paid to Hugh Cairns they gave \$165 due
 him \$14 to Thomas Long \$600, due him \$46
 to Joseph Long \$350 due him \$296 to Joseph Hoxley
 \$400 over Cairns \$354 to Betty Hoxley \$655 over Cairns
 \$4 to Wm Hoxley \$1100 over Cairns \$254 to Betty Hoxley
 \$350 due her \$98 to Lewis Hoxley \$400 due her
 \$180 to Betty Hoxley \$655 over Cairns \$4 to
 Sophia Hoxley \$500 due him \$146, Wm Hoxley
 took by consent of all parties and signed \$300
