

In the name of God Amen, I John Perry of the County of Franklin being not in bodily health but of perfect sense and memory have made this my last will and Testament in manner and form following. To Wt.

Item, I Desire that my beloved Wife Elizabeth Perry have the use of all my Estate so long as she remains my Widow for the support of her and her Children and in case she decease then the whole of the said Estate that may be in her possession to be Equally Divided between my Children Andrew, Nancy, & Robert, Except the Horse I now own & her saddle which she is to have in her own use. Any of my Children before named should (die without heirs) or before they come of Lawfull age that their part of said Estate shall be Equally Divided among those still surviving.

Lastly I appoint and constitute Robert Perry, Rodrick Perry and John Henrich Executors of this my last will & Testament a doing and confirming this and Discharging all others whatsoever. In Witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal this 14th day of October 1796.

Attest of Kentucky etc. In a Court held for Franklin County on Tuesday the 15th day of November 1796. A writing purporting to be the last will and Testament of John Perry was shewen in Court by the Oathes of John Henrich, Rodrick Perry, & Robert Perry, which is ordered to be read.

Thomas Pinderster In the name of God Amen, I Thomas Pinderster my sole into the hands of God and my body to the dust from which it came. Being in perfect sense and memory I now make this my last will and Testament of what it hath pleased God to give me

in manner as followeth. (First) 1<sup>st</sup> My Desire is that all my Just Debts should be paid. 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son James Two Negroes by the names of Phillis and Martin and give to him and his heirs forever.

3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Two Negroes by the names of Tom & Sam and feather Bed and Furniture to him and his heirs forever. 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son Richard One Negro Wench by the name of Betty and her increase to him and his heirs forever.

5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my son George Two Negroes by the names of Sally & Milly & their increase to him and his heirs forever.

6<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Jones Cammacks One Negro Woman named Mary and her increase, One feather Bed & Furniture to her and her heirs forever.

7<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy three Negroes by the names of Hannah, James & Lide, & their increase, One feather Bed & Furniture to her & her heirs forever.

8<sup>th</sup> My Desire is that those Negroes I sold for my life should be collected and Equally Divided among my Children (To Wt) my son Gabriel, Thomas, Robert, James, Richard, George, and my daughter Molly Corby's heirs Wt. Tithe Corby, Nicholas, Mamma Betsey, & Garland, My Daughter Elizabeth Jones Cammacks, & her heirs and their increase to them and their heirs forever.

9<sup>th</sup> I give unto Garland Corby's Daughter (Betsey) One Negro by the name of Milly and her increase to her and her heirs forever.
