Item It is my will and desire that the said Burwell Chiles shall also have all or any sum or sums of money due or to be come to me and I do give the same to him and his heirs forever.

In the name of God, Amen I Peter Shepherd of Patterson town and County in the State of Maryland being at the time of sound and Chaste mind Memory and understanding but on account of the uncertainty of this transitory life and of the certainty of Death Do make publish and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following. This is to say: I give and bequeath my soul unto the hands of Almighty God for whom I believe in and my Body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereof appointed and appointed and as to the following worldly goods with which I have been provided I give and bequeath in the following manner. To my son and daughter all that town or parcel of land situate and lying on the Maryland River in the State of Virginia containing Eight hundred and also I give and bequeath three thousand five hundred acres of land situate in the State of Virginia and about the bottom of the river and also all other the rest and residue of my estate

said Settlements of Kentucky to be equally Divided among my  
 Children, Adam, Michael, Peter, William, Margaret, Elizabeth,  
 Mary and Susannah, in Equal Parts and Share and Share alike,  
 It Also and to Note, all and singular the lands above mentioned  
 unto and to the use of my said Children, Adam, Michael, Peter,  
 William, Margaret, Elizabeth, Mary and Susannah, Share and Share  
 alike, and to their heirs and assigns forever. Provided always and  
 it is my will and desire that my son Adam Shepherd have the  
 aforementioned Tract of Land of Fifteen hundred acres of Land on the  
 Falls of the River as a part of his Share or portion of the whole of the  
 said Lands above Decreed, and Provided also, That if any of my  
 said Children should Die before he she or they attain the age of then  
 to the years or Day of Marriage, that then and in that case his her or  
 their Share or Portion of the Lands above devised shall be Equally  
 Divided Share and Share alike among the Survivors of my said Children.  
 And Provided further That my Executors hereinafter named shall have  
 full Power and absolute Authority to sell and to convey six Thousand acres  
 of my said Lands, if they shall judge it proper and expedient for  
 the purpose of supporting the Mothers of my said Children and to pay  
 and discharge the Expenses hereafter for the Yearly keeping the Land above  
 mentioned. And I do hereby constitute and appoint my son William  
 my Eldest wife Elizabeth, and my son Michael to be the Executors of this  
 my last will and Testament, fully, lawfully and lawfully and all other  
 and former Wills by me heretofore made, and Declaring this to be my  
 last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
 hand and affixed my seal this first day of Day of May - in the  
 Year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and Eighty Second

 by the said Testator as and for his last

I, Andrew Johnston, knowing the uncertainty of this mortal life, being of sound mind & perfect memory (blessed be almighty God for the same) do make and publish this my last will & testament, in manner & form following, to wit: I give and bequeath unto beloved wife Elizabeth Johnston during her natural life all my property real & personal, house & negro goods & chattels, & after her death to be equally divided between her Children, James, Elizabeth Jane (a. William Lewis & Harrison), to hold to them & their heirs forever. I will that my last debts should be paid, if any remain at my death, and that the remainder of my personal estate be divided together with the real as before directed first to my wife and her natural life, & then to the Children - hereby revoking all former wills by me made, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this day of September 25. 1819.
