

I John W. McLanage of Franklin County and State of Kentucky do hereby make this my last will and testament revoking all others being weak of body but of perfect sense and memory.

First I wish all my just debts to be paid, they are but few and none of magnitude.

Secondly I desire my moiety of my estate of my land whatsoever remaining after the payment of my debts, to my sister Polly Stale and her heirs forever.

Thirdly I devise the other moiety of my estate to my executors hereinafter mentioned, to be appropriated by them in their discretion to the use of my sister Belcy, wife of John and her heirs forever.

Fourthly The division of my estate to be made by my executors according to their discretion.

Fifthly My wish is that my executors should not be compelled to give the bond and security as required by law, nor to be liable to any suits and expenses and a special verdict. Therefore I wish my father Thomas McLanage and my brother in law Thomas Stale, executor of this my last and true testament.

I Philip White of Franklin County do hereby make and declare this my last will and testament revoking all others heretofore made in manner & form following (to wit) I confirm and ratify the gift already made to my son John White of a Negro man named Samy also nine hundred and fifty dollars to purchase land also the stock already given Samy &c

I have given & bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth McFarren the property which she has already received be disposed of as follows when Lucy Clarke comes of age her sister Ellen or marry the Negroes Nancy & her children and Ann or her price for which she was sold to be divided into three parts One third to Lucy One third part to Elizabeth and the balance with furniture stock &c to my Daughter Elizabeth, then should Lucy or Ellen die without their part of the property is to revert back to Elizabeth Mother and her heirs also the amount of

to be received by their Executors James McPherson and one  
did in like manner as the property above mentioned  
Item I confirm and ratify the gift of a negro woman  
named Jane and other property which has been received  
to my son Zachariah White together with one half of  
the sheriffly and the proceeds arising therefrom I also  
give him a negro boy named Willson.

Item I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth & Thomas  
White all the Lots & buildings with their appurtenances in  
Lawrenceburgh also the Tract of Land recently purchased  
of Merriam Allen lying on Robinsons Creek to be  
equally divided between them I also confirm & ratify  
the gift of one half of the Sheriffly on the south side  
of the Kentucky River to Thomas also I give unto him  
Two hundred dollars in cash and Everard White Six  
hundred dollars.

Item I confirm & ratify the gift already made  
to Joseph White of a negro woman Judette Horner  
Book & money to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give unto Jefferson & Philip White the same  
called Pleasant level containing 26 acres to be divided  
as follows (viz) all that part of the same on the south  
side of the the Springfield road beginning at the  
end of the land just to McPhersons farm and a  
long said line with a straight line to where it will  
strike the land purchased of Allen I give unto  
Jefferson and as on the north side of the Springfield  
road including the Dwelling house &c. unto Philip  
White which Division shall take place when the come  
of lawful age.

Item I lend unto my daughter Martha Foster two  
negro girls Polly & Caroline and their increase  
during her natural life and at her death to be heirs  
if any she has together with a horse, cow, head of swine  
which she has received. I also bind that proportion  
of money & property that may fall to her part

at her mothers death when equally divided unto her  
heirs for ever to be held in Trust by my executor for her use  
for the use of her body and hands over to them when in their  
Judgment they may think proper which money is to be  
kept upon Interest until received by her & her heirs.

Item I direct that my executor shall make sale of all  
the Farming utensils, Stock & Furniture together with any  
House Mills & Distillery which two articles is to be removed  
from off my Land. I also direct my Executor to rent  
out the Farm Pleasant level under Particulars & Restrictions  
until Jefferson & Philip shall come of age at which time  
they shall have a right to take possession.

I also direct that the Farm now in dispute or in Law  
near Lexington shall be rented sold or compromised  
by my Executor as in their Judgment they may think  
most advisable. I also direct that all my negro except

those that are otherwise disposed of and a negro woman  
named Esther together with any one that my wife Lucy  
White may think proper to select or make choice of to  
keep during her natural life shall be hired out until  
their Death. I also wish that my wife Lucy White is to  
be at liberty to call upon & Draw from my Executor any

money that she & they may think necessary for her general  
support during her life. And I direct that Jefferson  
and Philip shall be kept at school and well educated  
clothed &c. out of the proceeds of the rent of Land a heap of negro  
or any money which may be in the hands of the Executors unless  
they may come of age. And I also direct that at the death of  
my wife Lucy all the money arising from the hire of  
negroes, rent of Land and sale of property after payment  
the amount otherwise appropriated shall be equally  
divided between my Daughter Martha Foster & my

not otherwise disposed of shall be sold and divided  
as above mentioned unless my Executor think it advisable  
to have de Equae. Division of the negroes remaining and he  
is not otherwise disposed of.

I do hereby appoint Zachariah White Executor of this my last will & Testa-  
ment made this sixth day of July in the year of Christ  
one thousand eight hundred & twenty two.

The property referred to in this my last will and  
Testament consists of the following parcels to wit, a tract  
or parcel of Land situated in the county of Jefferson  
and state aforesaid, adjoining the land of  
William Lee, an a purchase of that of Reynolds  
containing about sixty acres and one half acre  
also a negro boy slave named Anthony, four hundred  
dollars in money now in the hands of Mr. Joseph Taylor  
together with sundry articles of household furniture  
all of which parcels of property as aforesaid, I do  
by this my last will and Testament bequeath  
and give unto my said mother Agnes Montague as aforesaid  
And in the third place I do appoint my said  
mother Agnes Montague my sole Executor for the  
for the direction of the aforesaid premises.
