and the use of all my Property both Real & Personal (except my
Books) so long as she shall choose to remain in said House

but should she choose to remove or go to Carolina I then re-
my Executors to furnish her with her choice of my Arms & gun
new saddle - I will that if my Children, Daniel, John
Stephen, John, Sarah, Isaac, Richard & Benjamin, Charles
(under my bequest) take them they are at liberty for their
Death or Removal of my Widow I will that my Executors
shall not sell any part of my Property
