Signed, sealed, and delivered by the said John Gano as for his last Will & Testament in the presence of us, who were present at the Signing & Sealing thereof.

In the name of God Amen I Samuel Tracy of the County of Franklin and Commonwealth of Kentucky do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following I do hereby bequeath I do give that my just Debts & Legacies to be paid by my Executors hereafter named - And I give to my son John Tracy, One half a Crown and no more - to my Daughter Polly Slaughter One half a Crown and no more - Betty Percant, James Tracy, & Peggy Tracy at my decease to have my whole Estate both Real and Personal divided between them, each to have an Equal proportion. I appoint Thomas M. Quady, James Smart, William Payne & Thomas M. Cooney the Executors of my last Will and Testament. And whatever my said Executors shall do or have done shall be as valid in Law as if I had done the same myself. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this Twentieth day of February in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred and four.
