(which I lent to my Daughter Ann Garnett and she  
has increase to be equally divided amongst the  
Ann Garnett's surviving Children, when she shall come  
to the age of Eighteen years. 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my son

John Garnet gives shillings in 11<sup>th</sup> I lent to my Daughter  
Jally Gibson one Negro (Book) until Mr. Gibson gets of age.  
then the said William Gibson is to have him during his life  
and his heirs forever begettin of him forever, But if he should  
die without issue the said Negro Book is to be equally divided  
amongst my Daughter Jally Gibsons surviving children.

I likewise give Mr. Gibson my horses, my cattle and my sheep  
5<sup>th</sup> I give all the rest of my Estate to my Daughter  
Jally Gibson. And her heirs, except a Negro woman named Moll  
which at my Death shall be at perfect liberty, and is my  
request that my Executors and Executors, which I hereby  
appoint namely Edmund Vaughans, John Brown, & Ernest  
Dr. Martine, might see that it was seen and lawfully done  
so likewise the contents of my last Will and Testament: In  
Witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my  
seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of February 1796.
