Item, I Desire that my beloved Wife Elizabeth Perry have the use of all my Estate so long as she remains my Widow for the support of her and her Children and in case she decease then the whole of the said Estate that may be in her possession to be Equally Divided between my Children Andrew, Nancy, & Robert, Except the Horse I now own & her saddle which she is to have in her own use of my Children before named should (die without heirs) or before they come of Lawfull age that their part of said Estate shall be Equally Divided among those still surviving.

Lastly I appoint and constitute Robert Perry, Rodrick Perry and John Henrich Executors of this my last will & Testament a doing and confirming this and Discharging all others whatsoever In Witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal this 14th day of October 1796.

in manner as followeth (First) 1st My Desire is that all my Just Debts should be paid. 2nd I give and bequeath unto my son James Two Negroes by the names of Phillis and Martin and give to him and his heirs forever.

3rd I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Two Negroes by the names of Tom & Sam and feather Bed and Furniture to him and his heirs forever. 4th I give and bequeath unto my son Richard One Negro Wench by the name of Pe Tom and her increase to him and his heirs forever.

5th I give and bequeath unto my son George Two Negroes by the names of Sally & Milly & their increase to him and his heirs forever.

6th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Jones Cammacks One Negro Woman named Mary and her increase, One feather Bed & Furniture to her and her heirs forever.

7th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy three Negroes by the names of Hannah, James & Lide, & their increase, One feather Bed & Furniture to her & her heirs forever.

8th My Desire is that those Negroes I sold for my life should be collected and Equally Divided among my Children (To Wt) my son Gabriel, Thomas, Robert, James, Richard, George, and my daughter Molly Corby's heirs Wt. Tithe Corby, Nicholas, Mamma Betsy, & Garland, My Daughter Elizabeth Jones Cammacks, & her heirs and their increase to them and their heirs forever.

9th I give unto Garland Corby's Daughter (Betsy) One Negro by the name of Milly and her increase to her and her heirs forever.

John Perry Will

In the name of God Amen, I John Perry of the County of Franklin being not in bodily health but of perfect sense and memory have made this my last will and Testament in manner and form following. To Wt.

Item, I desire that my beloved wife Elizabeth Perry have the use of all my Estate so long as she remains my Widow for the support of her and her Children and in case she marries then the whole of the said Estate that may be in her possession to be Equally Divided between my Children Scitgorol, Nancy, & Robert, Except the Horse I now own & her saddle which she is to have for use. Any of my Children before named should (Die without Heir) or before they come of Lawfull age that their part of said Estate shall be Equally Divided among those still surviving.

Lastly I appoint and constitute Robert Perry, Rodrick Perry and John Henrich Executors of this my last will & Testament a loving and confirming this and Disannulling all others whatsoever. In Witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal this

in manner as followeth. (First) 1st My Desire is that all my Just Debts should be paid. 2nd I give and bequeath unto my son James two Negroes by the names of Phillis and Martin one given to him and his Heirs forever.

3rd I give and bequeath unto my son Robert two Negroes by the names of Tom & Ann and feather Bed and furniture to him and his Heirs forever. 4th I give and bequeath unto my son Richard one Negro & Couch by the name of Joe Ann and her increase to him and his Heirs forever.

5th I give and bequeath unto my son George two Negroes by the names of Sally & Milly & their increase to him and his Heirs forever.

6th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Jones Cammacks one Negro Woman named Mary (her increase) and one feather Bed & Furniture to her and her Heirs forever.

7th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy three Negroes by the names of Hannah, James & Jack, & their increase, one calf, one feather Bed & Furniture to her & her Heirs forever.

8th My Desire is that those Negroes I sold for my life should be collected and Equally Divided among my Children (To Wt) my son Gabriel, Thomas, Robert, James, Richard, George and my Daughter Molly Cosby's Heirs Wt. Tithe Cosby, Nicholas, Thomas Betsy, & Garland, My Daughter Elizabeth Jones Cammacks, & her them and their increase to them and their Heirs forever.

9th I give unto Garland Cosby's Daughter (Betsy) one Negro by the name of Milly and her increase to her and her Heirs forever.

10^{thly} I Give and bequeath unto Garland Cosby son, & Wth Elizabeth Cosby, Nicholas, Isaac, & Garland, One Negro Woman by the name of Dinah and her increase, to them and their heirs forever. 11^{thly} I Give and bequeath all my Lands to be Equally Divided among all my Children (Wth my son John, Gabriel, Thomas, Robert, James, Richard, George and my Daughter Molly Cosby's heirs (Wth Elizabeth Cosby, Nicholas, Isaac, & Garland my Daughter Elizabeth I, Hannah and Lucy to them and their heirs forever.

12^{thly} I Give and bequeath unto my son Gabriel One Horse and Plantation Tools & One large Looking Glass to him & his heirs forever. I do appoint my son Thomas Poindester James Poindester & Garland Cosby Executors of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fifteenth day of July One thousand Seven hundred and ninety six.

Codicile

Thomas Poindester's Will

Annexed to the above will, my Desire that all the residue of my Estate both real and personal that has not been heretofore mentioned should be sold & my Heirs & the Balance of the money to be applied to the use of purchasing of a Horse for my Daughter Lucy & her heirs forever. Also my Desire is the old Negro Wench she should be set at liberty the remainder part of her days.

Thomas Poindester

At a Court held for the County of Franklin on Tuesday the Eighteenth day of January 1797.

The last Will and Testament of Thomas Poindester Esq^r was produced in Court and being heretofore approved and ordered to be recorded, except as to the Codicile thereto Annexed, the same having no subscribing Witnesses, thereupon Christ: Cammack & Bro: Perry came into Court and made Oath that they were acquainted with the hand writing of the said deceased and that they believed the said signature to the said Codicile was written with the hand of the said Poindester, thereupon ordered that the same be recorded. thereupon James Poindester one of the Executors named in the said Will having entered into Bond with Christ:

Cammack & Bro: Perry his Securities in the sum of One thousand pounds: He having qualified agreeable to Law, on his motion, ordered that Probate be granted him in Due form.
