 estate of John W. Brown decd. and make  
 the foregoing Report. Given under our hands

In Obedience to an Order of the worshipful Court  
 of Franklin to us directed we proceeded to review these and  
 determine on the price of the negroes of John Cutchfield  
 allotting to the widow her share & designating what  
 negroes are to go to each child & their respective value and  
 determine as follows The negroes Rachel & Child we value  
 at \$450 Boy Lewis at \$350 making in all \$800 which  
 we allot to the widow the paying to Wm Lewis one of the  
 heirs \$60 & 62 cents.  
 The negroes Dilly we value at \$350 & by John at  
 \$150 in all \$500 which we allot to Thomas Cutchfield  
 he pay Wm Lewis \$11. 13<sup>cts</sup>.  
 The negroes Eddy we value at \$350 & Girl Aggy  
 a \$150 in all \$500 which we allot to Maria Cutchfield  
 she pay Wm Lewis \$11. 13<sup>cts</sup> and we finally  
 allot to Wm Lewis negro woman Amy at \$100, as  
 we determine that he receive the sums as stated  
 on the other side due from the widow & children  
 Thomas & Maria amounting to \$88. 87 cts which will  
 make the share of each child \$488. 87.
