description and of every nature which I may have
at the time of my death or which may fall or
accrue to me I give bequeath & devise unto my
five nephews to wit Charles W. Wells John W.
Wells John Henry Wells Peter Wells John Andrew
Wells the sons of Doctor Charles Wells to be
equally divided between them and if any
of my said nephews should die before me it is
my will that those who survive me should
take the whole residue of my estate after the
satisfaction of the legacy herein before given
to my niece Martha I determine & appoint
my friend Joseph in law Doctor Charles Wells
and Executors of this my last will & testament &
confident of his faithful administration
I desire that one bond a security therefor
should be required of him I wish all
the officers well declaring that to be my

and I give & bequeath that all my real
estate and fixtures & appurtenances to wit
I will & bequeath unto my beloved daughter
Susan Wilson my negro woman slave Maria and
her future increase to her and her heirs and assigns
for & to all my interest of every kind whatsoever
whichever in the estate of my late wife Susan P.
Wilson to her, her heirs and assigns forever
Fourthly after the payment of my last debts
and funeral expenses as aforesaid I will & bequeath
that all the money and notes due me that I may
have left upon hand or on the hands of any third
person I give & bequeath to my wife Louisa
and I give & bequeath her share of to my brother Joseph
and I give & bequeath his heirs and assigns forever one fourth
part thereof to my brother William S. Wilson
his heirs and assigns forever One fourth part thereof
to my brother James S. Wilson his heirs and assigns
forever and the remaining fourth part thereof
to my beloved daughter Susan Wilson in trust for
the use & benefit of her if any three years or
more shall pass away from her she shall
be held by my said wife
