 and described, in the new sheet & pages
 annexed. Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint
 my beloved mother James Alderson aforesaid
 the executor of this my last will & testament
 and hereby will and desire that she have
 authority for granting probate will and
 acquit any security from any said executor
 in any manner or for any purpose connected
 with this my will and I further will and
 desire that no Inventory or appraisement
 of my estate be made other than such as
 my said executor may make out and

 I do authorize my executor to sell at private sale
 so much of my personal estate as may be necessary
 to pay my last debts & funeral expenses I do
 require that my executor may be permitted to act
 without giving any security touching the personal

 will & testament John Green as my executor of this my last will and
 testament having nothing all other. Given under
