I Gloria Brancham, a woman of color legally emancipated & enjoying the rights and privileges of a free woman of color, hereby constitute this paper as my last will & testament.

First I direct my executor, which I name dealely after my death, to sell when such reasonable terms as he may think proper, my land and all the personal property of which I am possessed, and out of the proceeds pay all my just debts, funeral expence and cost of administration. The balance of the money remaining, I desire to my executor in trust for the sole support and education of my three sons, all of whom are now Slaves, namely and called Peter Brancham, John Brancham and Wyatt Brancham, to be equally divided and paid to each of them when they shall be of age, and not to any other person or persons whatsoever.

Second In the event I should survive my executor or he should decline acting I request the County Court to appoint a prudent, safe and discreet man as administrator with this my will annexed who is hereby invested with all the powers of my executor.

Third My executor or administrator who may be appointed on the contents above stated shall have full power to execute a conveyance in due form of my land. Fourth I constitute Robert W. Smith executor of this my last will hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me.

1st It is my desire that all of my just debts shall be paid

2nd It is my desire that my wife Hannah Hawkins shall have the full possession of my farm, and to have the use & benefit thereof as she may think proper for the term of one year after my death.

3rd It is my desire that after my death that my beloved wife Hannah Hawkins above mentioned shall have one third of all my estate to the personal use and support of her children with except my negro man Andrew who I wish to have sold and the proceeds thereof to be divided equally between all my children hereafter named except my son Julius H. Hawkins whom I have already given and advanced two hundred dollars and one third of my children, which is to be advanced from his portion of my estate. And I may have done or may be hereafter made.
