 benefit of my said children, after paying for expenses from a credit book which I
 desire my executor shall purchase and furnish John Stephens the son of James
 M. Stephens - Item 3rd I give and devise unto Rachel the above
 mentioned and set free as aforesaid the lot of ground with the improvements
 and improvements thereon now occupied by me and which I purchased from
 Thomas Flynn, which I desire she shall hold and enjoy during her natural life
 and at her death to be to my said children or the survivors of them
