 kind I wish to be equally divided among my children
 or such of them as may be living at my death and lastly
 I appoint my said son Benjamin Ellis executor of this my
 last will and testament not doubting but that he will execute
 it faithfully as witness my hand and seal this 25th day
 of July 1835
