she might have been entitled to, and in the condition, that she renounce,  
all claims to dower or a distributable part of my said estate, the said  
said, and do hereby direct my said trustee to pay for the sum of five hundred  
Dollars per annum for and during the period of her natural life  
2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my sister, Mrs. Wm. Featherston and  
Phebe Talbot each fifteen shares of stock in the Bank of Kentucky  
and my trustee are authorized & requested to transfer the same to her  
3<sup>d</sup> I desire that my trustee shall convey some to her lands, a  
sum of money sufficient to satisfy, entirely, and completely in my situation  
they may in their own opinion see proper, my long & valuable daughter  
Cordelia W<sup>o</sup> Talbot, out of part of her money stock in order to her  
reason, it is my will that she shall have an equal share of my estate with  
the rest of my children to be made when a suitable sum of money shall be  
gathered, and to be given to her either in steps of my trustee, or of more  
Dollars, as she may think fit  
4<sup>th</sup> I give that my daughter Cordelia  
5<sup>th</sup> The purpose of making my daughter Mary Louisa a ward of the  
law, and to make it to be made when the said sum of one hundred  
dollars to be paid in some convenient part of my estate shall permit  
6<sup>th</sup> I require to provide the said sum for the purpose of completing her  
education, the sum of five hundred dollars, which shall be increased  
to be some five thousand dollars on condition that in my will will  
permit the expense of her education under the supervision & care  
of my said trustee or 8<sup>th</sup> Every part of my estate to my daughter  
Elizabeth Dudley and her property to the amount according to my  
estimate of about eight thousand five hundred dollars, to my daughter  
which I demand respect & should receive from the estate of my  
said wife some thousand dollars, to my son William Talbot money  
of his property to the amount of four thousand dollars, I hereby require  
and direct my said trustee in full & selling up, adjusting & paying over  
the amount of the proceeds of my estate, that they lay out in contribution  
the various amounts of said as hereafter against each of my aforesaid children  
and their several distributives, after the payment of all the charges, legal  
costs, & expenses my children, Elizabeth Dudley, Elizabeth P. Samuel and  
William Talbot all such sums of money as shall belong to said estate  
9<sup>th</sup> I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint Col<sup>o</sup> Peter  
Dudley, Genl James Garret and Charles P. Woodhead

(The trustee herein before mentioned) my executors, administrators, assigns,  
having full & entire confidence in their honesty, ability and integrity, being  
that no security shall be demanded by the trustees of them
