 during her life time, and the life time of her mother Mrs Bell as aforesaid
 Called Charlette, and after the death of them I give the said Letty the care
 of any to my niece Frances Anne Mitchell daughter of John Lewis
 Secondly I give to each of the daughters of my brother Peter W Daniel, Elizabeth
 And Anne one Share of Bank Stock to each
 Thirdly All the rest of my personal real and personal bank Stock, money
 bonds &c I give to the daughters of my brother Jean Wood Lewis
 wife Simple to be equally divided among them except my share in
 work stand and a piece - The same I give to Susan W Lewis, The work
 stand and a piece I give to Lincy W Lewis together with my tools
 I hereby appoint George Wythe Lewis my executor. In Witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 17th day

Broadhead I Lucas Broadhead make my last will & testament as follows
 I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary Maria Broadhead for and during her life
 all my estate real personal and mixed, and at her death, I give to be equal
 the same to my children or such of them as may be then living, and to the share
 of such as may be then dead equally to be divided between them -
 I further give to my wife full power and authority to sell & convey all or
 or such part of my said estate as may be necessary for the payment of my just
 debts, the proceeds of such sale after the payment of my debts to be held
 and used by her for herself during her life and then for the use of my
 children or their issue as before mentioned - Lastly I hereby appoint
 my said wife the executrix of my will and Orlando Brown Esq. my
 executor of the same - I give to my son Lucas Broadhead my gold watch to be
 taken out of my personal estate before disposed of

 also that my daughter Catherine shall have at that age unless she should marry before
 then at her marriage one Cent half a side Saddle, and Bedstead of her own
 which will make them equal with my other children
 Second - It is my will and desire that my beloved wife Rachael shall have during
 her life or widow hood my three Slaves Sarah Prudence Jane and Ann and the
 back of land on which they now live, and my Stock farming clothes Crockery
 household furniture &c of which I may die possessed for the support of herself and the
 support and Education of my two youngest children
 Third It is my will and desire that all my interest in the estate of my dear
 of my father Eleuthero Moore deceased if there be a sufficient amount to be distributed
 by my executor herein after named to the purchase of negro boy to and and a part
 my wife during her life or widow hood a part in cultivating the poor and many
 and educating my two youngest children, but should there not be a sufficient amount
 my interest in said estate for the purchase then by said wife if she think proper may
 sell dispose of any of my personal estate to and make purchase of said boy
 Fourth It is my will and desire that at the death or marriage of my said
 wife as aforesaid all my estate both real and personal to equally divided
 among my seven children Mrs Elizabeth McWhitt, James Moore, Elizabeth
 Moore Mary Ann Smith, Jackson Moore, John Moore and Catherine Moore or their
 children or the descendants of the children of such of them as may be dead at the
 marriage or death of my said wife - Lastly I hereby appoint my
 son Mitchell Smith executor of this my last will and testament - In witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 29th day of November 1849.
