intermarriage the land to be rented out, and the negroes to be
hired and the proceeds arising therefrom to be equally appro-
priated to the education and maintenance of my
unmarried children and when my youngest child arrives at
the age of twenty years of age my wish and desire it is that
all my property be equally divided amongst all my
children Vizt Emily S B Nolan Thomas Hall Sarah Ann Hall
Mary Porter Hall Lucretia Hall William Hall and John
Hall and last I appoint my friend William S Waller,
Executor to this my last will and Testament, in witness my
hand and seal this seventeenth day of April 1825

I Solomon P Sharp constitute this my last will and
testament, revoking all others. I appoint my wife Eliza P Sharp
my sole executrix and request the Court not to require from her
any security for the execution of this trust,
I release her from any obligation that the law might impose on her
to sell any part of my personal estate. I hereby authorize &
empower my said executrix to sell any portion of my real
estate or slaves for the support and advancement of my family
my trunk, spinning, farms and farm near Bowling Green only except
but in the execution of this trust, she is to take the advice of one or more
of my brothers whose approbation is to be given in writing - all the
powers conferred by this will on my executrix are to continue only
during her widowhood and at her death this will is absolutely to
cease in all its operations and no one appointed by any Court
are to acquire the power by law to execute any trust, in this will
In relation to all my property it is my will that it pass according
to the provisions of the Law my wife and children to receive their
respective proportions of and interest in my estate as they would
be entitled to by Law had this will never have been made
In witness whereof I hereby set, my hand and seal this
fifteenth day of September 1824

divided between my children with the exception of Isaac P
Merrick who is to receive none the other two thirds of my
Land and remaining monies I wish equally divided among
my children as they become of age (at 21 years of age) in equal
proportions, which is to continue and settle and settle and settle
