Oaths of P. Sargent and John H. Hanna the subscribing Witnesses thereto  
Whereupon It is ordered that the said Will & Codicils be removed, which is  
done accordingly

Samuel and deceased on the twenty fourth day of July A.D. 1850  
do make, this my last will and testament - After the payment of my  
just debts, I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Martha D. Beach  
wife of Daniel Beach of Graves Co Ky the Sum of two hundred dollars  
and my grand daughter Malissa Dickinson daughter of Andrew G  
Dickinson of the State of Illinois the Sum of two hundred dollars and to  
my daughter Grammie wife of John Brown I give and bequeath my  
Slave Adaline (now living with Mr Mitchell & Miller of W. Va. by name, &c  
in trust and for the use of my grand daughter Elizabeth Garrison  
daughter of Jacob T. Dickerson of Kentucky, to bring up the said Elizabeth  
till she can remain with said Grammie Brown, or in case in which the said  
Elizabeth shall leave the said Grammie Brown or shall die the said slave  
Adaline to belong absolutely to Grammie Brown and in case said Grammie  
shall die leaving Elizabeth the said slave Adaline to be the property of said Elizabeth  
Further more I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Grammie Brown  
certain notes given by John Brown to me at deceased times amounting to eight  
hundred dollars, to have and hold to her heirs and assigns forever  
I also give and bequeath to my daughter Julia Ann wife of R. T. Allen my  
Slave Malinda until the twenty first year of age which time she shall be free  
I give further more to my daughter Julia Ann wife of the deceased R. T. Allen  
four hundred dollars of a note now held by me against R. T. Allen husband  
of the said Julia Ann - And I give and bequeath to my two grand daughters  
Elizabeth G. and Martha M. Dickerson the share of said Jacob T. Dickerson the  
Sum of two hundred dollars each - The residue and remainder of my  
property I give to be equally divided between my three children Andrew  
Jackson Dickerson of the State of Illinois Sophia C. Jones wife of Jacob Jones  
of the State of Kentucky and Manerva M. Green wife of Green of the  
State of Illinois And it is my further will that the aforementioned slave  
shall not be removed from Washington City D.C. without her consent  
And I do further more give and bequeath to my son Jacob T. Dickerson  
of the State of Kentucky all the unsettled accounts or claims of all kinds  
that I am entitled to as coming from the estate of my deceased husband

Labinger & Allen Gov of the State of Maryland

And I deem that my son Jacob T. Dickerson shall be my sole executor  
this my last will & testament. Witness my hand and seal this twenty fourth day  
of July A.D. 1850

To John M. Sharp of Warren County Ky I give my boy John ten shares of Stock  
in the Bank of Kentucky, and the one third of my entire interest in the lot,  
grounds and meadow above the Penitentiary situate in County of Franklin  
I also give him the claim against Grizzle for the sale of John's hand  
by Thomas Strang

To Jane M. Reed of Frankfort Ky I give ten shares of Stock in bank of  
Ky my boy Sam, and the one third interest in the lot, grounds and meadow  
situate above the Penitentiary in County of Franklin

The balance of my estate I wish to be divided equally between Jane M. Reed  
& John M. Sharp

I appoint J. M. & J. L. Sharp & W. D. Reed as executors, they and  
have this 8th April 1851
