of & release, and I do hereby emancipate, Manumit & set him free at my  
death, and whenever I may hereafter appear in my court or  
circuit, or upon whomsoever the charge may devolve of executing my  
will, It is my express & positive direction to them, to see that to do all  
aforegoing things, that may be necessary & proper to perfectly accomplish the  
emancipation & freedom of the said negro, in testimony whereof I do  
subscribe my hand & seal this 24<sup>th</sup> day of October 1834.

Be it remembered that I Benjamin Farmer of the County of Franklin  
State of Kentucky, do hereby certify that I am of sound mind & memory & knowing the nature & extent  
of this life & being desirous to dispose of all my worldly goods which  
it hath pleased god to bestow upon me with deliberate & published other my last will  
and testament in manner & form to wit: 1<sup>st</sup> I give to my beloved wife  
Susannah G. Farmer during her natural life or widowhood the  
tract of land whereon I now live containing one hundred & six (106) acres  
together with the following slaves, to wit: Florash, Andy, Julia,  
Mary, Rosa, Marthy, Amias, except what may be hereafter excepted.  
Also my personal estate except what may hereafter be excepted  
2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my son Thomas Farmer a horse equal to either of the  
horses I gave to my sons John G. or Lier G. Farmer which I bought  
out of the personal estate I owned to my wife. 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my daughter

Sally Cook a horse equal to either of the horses I gave to my son John G. or Lier  
G. Farmer which I bought out of the personal estate I owned to my wife. 4<sup>th</sup> I give  
to my daughter Sally a negro girl out of the slaves owned to my wife during the  
time of my wife, and it is further my will & desire that at the death of my wife  
my daughter Sally to have choice of either of the girls, Mary or Marthy, at their  
value - 5<sup>th</sup> I give to my son John G. Farmer a horse out of the personal estate  
I owned to my wife equal to either of the horses I gave to my son John G. or Lier  
Farmer or 5<sup>th</sup> I give to my son Benjamin Farmer a horse out of the  
personal estate I owned to my wife equal to either of the horses or  
Prattles I gave to my son John G. or Lier Farmer to be delivered to him when he arrives  
at the age of twenty years, old or 6<sup>th</sup> It is my will & desire that the legacy coming  
to me from my father's estate and I do hereby bequeath & divide among my  
children to wit: John G. Farmer, Lier G. Farmer, Thomas Farmer, Sally Cook,  
Tapsley Farmer, & Benedict Farmer - And lastly at the death of my wife  
Susannah it is my will & desire that all the real & personal estate with the money  
to be equally divided my son Benjamin, John G., Lier G., Thomas, Sally, Tapsley &  
Benedict Farmer and I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife Susannah  
and my son John G. Farmer executor & executor to the said my last will & testament.  
Witness my former will, made by me in testimony hereof I have hereunto set  
my hand & seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1836.

This my last will and testament of John Julian, write, publish, own hand this  
24<sup>th</sup> day of August 1833. Item 1<sup>st</sup> It is my wish & desire, that my wife Jane Julian  
have the tract of land on which we now contain 314 acres purchased of James  
Thurly four acres of Hamilton 318 acres during her life &c.  
Item 2<sup>nd</sup> It is my will that my said wife have all the slaves purchased by  
Morgan Cook & another house hold &c. when furnished, to wit: the land with  
during her life, but not to dispose of but separate her self from the profit & income  
Item 3<sup>rd</sup> It is my will that my wife have the following negroes, or part  
old Moses, Daniel & Charles the son of Ann (late P. Wall's land) But the  
son of Ann & for 3 years children at my death or Henry G. It is my  
will & desire that my youngest son Alexander Julian may have at the death  
of my wife the tract of land which she purchased for life of 314 acres and all the  
things purchased by Morgan Cook & another house hold &c. at her death, when she  
placed on which we now live on Item 4<sup>th</sup> It is my will that my said wife  
have the two negroes (the best) and I do hereby constitute & appoint my  
deaths to make her to have her land &c. the balance of my money to be  
divided among the children
