my beloved wife Elizabeth Executrix of this my last will and testament  
revising and annulling all former wills by me made

4<sup>th</sup> I it further wish that my boy Levi and Girl Margaret be sold  
privately to the former Government to his wife if can be and the title to a  
good Master, and the proceeds of same with all other (after paying the  
debt) be divided equally divid between my sisters  
Brothers and niece to be named Sarah Susan & Mary J. Conditon  
Jefferson Lewis Washington & Lafayette Conditon and a niece Ann  
P. Wilkes her portion to be paid to James M. Spaw for the Sister Fother Frasier  
appointed by my grand father and to be paid accordingly to divide
