 shall be paid to convey the same to the purchaser or purchasers by deed and the  
 proceeds of sale I desire and direct to be vested in some permanent stock or loan  
 out and the dividend or interest arising therefrom annually to be paid to my  
 sister Sarah Bacon in trust for the use and sole benefit of my brother Richard  
 A. Bacon during his natural life and at his death I desire the principal to  
 his children which may be then living to be equally divided between them  
 4. I will and desire the residue of my estate consisting of slaves money and  
 debts which may be owing me to my sister Sarah Bacon during her life and  
 at her death I desire the same to my sister Ann A. Fall and my brother  
 James M. Bacon Albert G. Bacon Richard A. Bacon and their heirs forever  
 5. I constitute and appoint Philip Sargent my Executor
