Bacon one thousand dollars, the sum in which they are equally divided, between my daughter Martha A. Bacon, Jane P. Bacon, Sarah Bacon and Mary Bacon - In the event of the death of my grand son William P. Bacon I desire the amount here allotted to him, to be given to my four daughters before named Martha A. Jane P. Sarah and Mary - Having heretofore and do my son Giles P. Bacon and Langston Bacon, I now devise to them all the debt due to me, or applying the amount due from them to me, I appoint by son Langston M. and Giles P. Bacon, brother for Will P. Bacon my grand son and authorize them to execute the one thousand dollars for the benefit in any way they may deem most advisable and proper. I hereby nominate and appoint my son Giles P. Bacon and Langston M. Bacon sole executors of the last will and testament and I set them with full power, to sell and dispose of in a conveyance any part of my estate either real personal or mixed, under the power above expressed, and require that no security be required of them by the County Court upon their giving up for my Executor.

Bacon at the death or marriage of my wife my two Slaves Charles & Henry to him and his heirs forever, Also two lots in South Frankfort known and designated upon the plat of said town by the numbers one

hundred and seventy seven and one hundred and one and which are situated which lot was given to by Page and Lupton - There was also another bond which my said son Edmond A. Bacon about the year 1830 gave to my son John M. Bacon for the purpose of - Frankfort - I have heretofore given to my son John M. Bacon two lots in said town and Ellen which I deem to be well paid and enjoy as his own property - I also hereby give and bequeath to my son John M. Bacon two lots in the town of South Frankfort which are known by the numbers one hundred and eighty one and one hundred and eighty two - which lot was also devised to be taken from lot No 179 and added to the ground above devised to him by Page and Lupton - I also desire my said son John M. Bacon to be bound to be taken from lot No 179 and added to the ground above devised to him by Page and Lupton of said town and part of a lot of ground at the death of myself and wife in case sooner given and deliver them by one or both of us - Fiftyly I will and bequeath unto my son William P. Bacon at the death or marriage of my wife my two Slaves Mary & Ellen and the two lots in said Frankfort devised to me by Page and Lupton and shown upon the plan or map of said town by their number one hundred and eighty three and one hundred and eighty four with an addition of ten of ground to be taken off of lot number one hundred and eighty two and added to the ground hereby devised to the said William P. Bacon - I charge my wife survive me, it is my will she shall keep and hold in her possession all the property belonging to me, and which has not been hereupon specifically devised - and should she deem it necessary she may be empowered to give to any one of her children such a share as she may think proper and make their respective shares, it being my will and desire that all my children shall be made equal in the residue of my property at the death of my self and wife - To this effect - That my will and desire that the residue hereunto directed to my son Edmond A. Bacon shall be held in trust by my sons John M. Bacon and William P. Bacon for the special use and benefit of the wife and children of my said son Edmond and that the said property or any portion thereof shall not at any time after my death be liable for the debts of the said Edmond A. Bacon - Twelfth - It is my will and desire that the property hereby devised to my son John M. Bacon shall be held in trust by my son Edmond A. Bacon and John M. Bacon for the special use and benefit of the wife and children of my said son William P. Bacon and that the said property or any portion thereof shall not at any time after my death be liable for the debts of the said William P. Bacon - Thirtieth - I do hereby make, constitute and appoint my said wife Patsy Bacon the sole executrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills and testaments which is required by the law in such cases and to perform executing and in Court as is required by the law for the full and due charge of her duties as executrix

lying on the road to Hunter, two yard Leamy fifty feet on Clinton Street &
adjoining the Black People Church and in clearing the house now here in
to be rented out - Fourthly The balance of my estate including the Sale of the
personal estate and the Sale of the lot of ten pay of the Legacy - I want to be
equally divided, the one half I give to my son Edmund Thomas Leland
of the city of New Orleans - Fifthly, the other half of my estate is to be
held by my executor & trustee for the use and benefit of my two grand children
Annica & Martha Slaw to enjoy both the estate of Francis Graham's and
and to be paid them in any that my executor & trustee may think best for
them Sixthly The way of coming from my house and lot is also to be
divided between my son one half where the other to my grand daughters
as in the fourth clause to be paid - Lastly I do hereby appoint Benjamin
Johnson Esqr Executor and trustee of this my last will & testament and
request the Franklin County Court not to require security of him for the discharge
of his duties as than the utmost confidence in his integrity that he will

Mare and the remainder of my property is to be sold and equally divided
between my children and at the death of my wife, Lewis and Cordelia are
