Item 2^d I desire that the profits of said estate alone shall be used during

appointed shall be to the
Item 3^d It is my will that all of my effects except my personal
slaves and such as I may hereafter acquire shall be converted in to money
and that all of my cost and charges shall be collected as soon as may
be and the proceeds shall be invested in land & negroes in such
proportion as my executor shall desire and the whole shall then be
held for the benefit of the Beneficiaries under this will as above directed.

Item 4th If I recover certain slaves for which I have paid in Buchanan
ham County Va I wish to give to my step grand son Henry Lee
Walkins one or more of said slaves equal in value to \$500 (five hundred
dollars) If I do not recover said slaves then it is my will that my executor
pay to him the said sum of my estate.

Item 5th I give to my Brother G. P. Patterson during his life an annuity
of \$120 (one hundred and twenty dollars) which shall be a charge upon
my whole estate.

Item 6th I constitute G. P. Mills executor of this my last will and
testament and desire that the court shall require the security of him
for discharge of his duties and I say in it upon him to collect the money
appointed due my estate and convert the said effect into money with prompti-
tude and it is my wish that he have then consult and advise with my
Trustee appointed and the make the investments aforesaid as he may think
proper the testimony whereof I hereunto subscribe my hand and affix my
hall this 19th day of May 1847

Whereas I Margaret Watt of the county of Franklin State of Kentucky
have made and executed my last will and testament in writing bearing
date the 19th day of May eighteen hundred & forty seven and have
thereby given and bequeathed to my step grand son Henry Lee
Walkins a certain bequest in the words and manner following Item 4th If I recover
certain slaves for which I have paid in Buchananham County Va I wish
to give to my step grand son Henry Lee Walkins one or more of said
slaves equal in value to \$500 (five hundred dollars) If I do not
recover said slaves then it is my will that my executor pay to him the
said sum out of my estate and whereas I have already under the provisions
of my last will & testament given and advanced to the said Henry
Lee Walkins a certain sum of money to purchase a certain sum of land

and comfort the said sum of five hundred dollars and said sum
which I have already advanced being all that I intend or desire that
he shall have of my estate Now I do by this my writing which I have
declared to be a codicil to said will and to be taken up as part thereof
revoke cancel and declare of no effect said clause in my said will for
the benefit of the said Henry Lee Walkins and I do hereby order and
declare that said sum of \$500 shall pass as any other property is done
in my said will & testament and lastly I do hereby declare that the my pre-
sents Codicil be annexed to and made a part of my last will and testament

1st I will that my property and the proceeds of my property of every descrip-
tion be equally divided between my son William and my beloved daughter
Harriet Virginia Russell 2^d It is my will that should my executors think
it proper they shall sell my farm on which I live upon such term and
upon such credit as they may consider best for the interest of my dear son
and that they make compromise thereof to the purchaser or purchasers
thereof 3rd It is my will that my executors shall take out a policy of
insurance upon the life of my negro man slave for his value and that they
have him out from time to time as they may consider will be best for the
interest of my son William to whom the said boy shall belong and
and in his own right the equal division above spoken of is to be made up
clear this portion of William to be equal to that of Harriet besides the
said boy I desire that my Brother William shall take my son William
in to his family and that he give the same watchful care and attention
to him that he gives his own children
I desire that my executors shall sell off all my personal property
