to the heirs for ever more or less
Fourth & Lastly It is my will and I do hereby constitute & appoint
my beloved wife Elizabeth executrix of this my last will and testament
revising and annulling all former wills by me made

dear brother Louis my watch, also wish my dearest wife to be taken care
that my Sister Susan has and send to my niece Ann P. Wilkes.

4th I it further wish that my boy Levi and Eric Margaret be sold
privately to the former Government to his wife if can be and the title to a
good Master, and the proceeds of same with all other (after paying the
debt due here named) I wish to be equally divid between my sisters
Brothers and niece to be named Sarah Susan & Mary J. Conditon
Jefferson Lewis Washington & Lafayette Conditon and a niece Ann
P. Wilkes her portion to be paid to James M. Spangenberg brother Francis
aparted by my grand father and to be paid accordingly to divide
