Thomas P. Major of the county of Franklin State of Kentucky do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following to wit

I will and devise that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid

I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Peggy Major for during her natural life the farm whereon I now reside containing twenty three & three quarters acres my negro man slave Charbon my woman slave Sarah all my horse hold and kitchen furniture farming utensils and stock of ewe kind and after her death I will and devise all and every part of the aforesaid property to my daughter Nancy S. Major to her and her heirs forever to be held unto by her as follows to wit an equal undivided half part to be held by her in trust for the sole use benefit & behoof of her sister Elizabeth Smith the other undivided half part for her own sole use benefit and behoof

I further will and devise to my said daughter Nancy S. Major in trust for the sole use benefit & behoof of her sister Elizabeth Smith aforesaid my slaves to wit Napoleon & Kelly and to her the said Nancy for her own sole use benefit and behoof my slaves to wit Henry alias Dick and Hannah and it is my will and desire that if either of my daughters should die without child or children that the portion which is such daughter to receive without child or children shall be equally divided between the others and my son Edward S. Major the said part between their children if any in such proportion as may be demanded to the part of the said

I will and desire that if my son Edward S. Major should return and require it that my daughter Nancy & Elizabeth give him one equal fourth part of the property here devised to them saving and excepting the negro slaves Napoleon Kelly Henry alias Dick and Hannah and that if my son Hugh Alexander Major should return and settle with his sister without suit or extortion to whom I have conveyed the land by deed that he holds a mortgage on for about \$500 that then and in that case it is my will that my said daughter give to her equal fourth part of the property hereby devised them saving and excepting as above the slaves Napoleon Kelly Henry alias Dick & Hannah but if the said Hugh A. Major should bring suit upon the before mentioned mortgage and thereby incur his loss to trouble and expense I only will him fifty dollars to be paid after the death of his mother provided my estate is sufficient to pay it without interference with the legacy before made. My son Walter S. Major having acquired the title to fifty acres of land that I bought from Adams how contrary to my will and wish and thereby as (I think) acquired without an adequate consideration as much of my estate as I have been enabled to devote to my other children

I therefore only will and bequeath unto the said Walter fifty dollars to be paid him after the death of his mother provided my estate may be sufficient to pay it without interfering with the legacies before made

Lastly I appoint my daughter Nancy S. Major executor and my nearest son in law John S. Smith executor of this my last will & testament and I seal and desire that no security shall be demanded or required of her my said daughter Nancy & the said Smith in testimony that the foregoing is my last will and testament I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 21st day of January 1830
