that my executor shall sell all my personal estate and the other part of my estate
lying on the road to Hunter, ten yard Leamy fifty feet on Clinton Street &
adjoining the Black People Church and in clearing the house known here in
to be rented out - Fourthly The balance of my estate including the Sale of the
personal estate and the Sale of the lot upon paying the Legacy I named later
equally divided, the one half I give to my son Edmund Thomas Leland
of the city of New Orleans - Fifthly, the other half of my estate is to be
held by my executor & trustee for the use and benefit of my two grand children
Annica & Martha Slaw to enjoy both estates of Francis & Francis and
and to be paid them in any that my executor & trustee may think best for
them Sixthly The way of coming from my house and lot is also to be
divided between my son one half where the other to my grand daughters
as in the fourth devise to be paid Lastly I do hereby appoint Benjamin
Johnson Esqr Executor and trustee of this my last will & testament and
request the Franklin County Court not to require security of him for the discharge
of his duties as than the utmost confidence in his integrity that he will
carry them out as my will - Witness my hand and seal this 29th day
